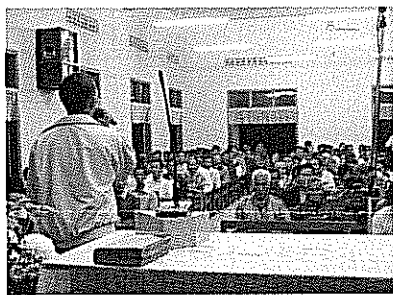

One would last for five days in the northern part of the country, and the second one would also last five days in the southern part near Yangon (Rangoon). All would have gone according to plan except the airline did not cooperate. As it turned out we had a week long meeting in the north. Most of these men came from the Chin State. More than seventy churches were represented by pastors, deacons and their families.



Abraham Ram Lian Uk did all of the translation work for me. He serves as a missionary with World Wide New Testament Baptist Mission.

I was given the opportunity to preach three times a day in these meetings. They gave me one and a half hours to one hour and forty-five minutes for each service. However, I could take two hours if needed! I can think of some preacher friends that would love to move to Myanmar for that opportunity.

These men were a blessing to be with. My only regret was that I could not communicate with them without someone translating every word.

Darleen had a wonderful time teaching the ladies while I was away, and they seemed to have enjoyed



themselves as well. These are just some of the women students at the Bible College that is lead by Pastor Timothy Mang. In one way or another all of Pastor Mang's brothers are involved with the school as well.

The conference in Yangon was for only two days because of the flight schedule change. Several missionaries from the area joined the college students for these services.

It was almost two-hundred years ago that America sent out our first missionaries. Judson sailed to India, but because of problems there he traveled on to Burma (Myanmar). He translated the Bible and it is still being used today. There are many evidences of the life he gave for this country. Not everything using his name has remained true, but praise the Lord the truth marches on. There are many faithful servants for our God in the land of Burma. There are several good schools that are training men and women for future service in the churches across the land. Pray that our Lord will sustain these folks by His grace and power.
