Dear Supporters and Friends,

Paraguay is at the top of our list and as you read this letter Bro. David Wise is in Villarrica, Paraguay beginning our National Pastor Training Program. He will be moving to Farsardie on the 28th, which is a small village with little accommodations and the going will be tough, but what isn't tough in Missions! Bro. Graham Gerald, a retired missionary, is with Bro. Wise and in April Bro. Charles Lacy will be flying down to help in the teaching also. A lot is happening right now and we certainly need your prayers in this endeavor of our Lord. We have discovered that our foundation paper work is in the courts hands and our prayer is that it will signed within the next week or so which will give us the liberty to do a lot of things in Paraguay that isn't possible at present. We have so many thoughts and ideas which will do a lot to further the Gospel once all the paperwork is finished.

January was a busy month with our BIBM Annual Winter Meeting. The weather cooperated just long enough for all our board members to get here, have the meeting and then get home before another round of snow moved in. God was gracious in everyone's travel and there were no problems. Our meeting revealed a good year in 2010 and a full year of ministry and projects for 2011.

Friends, our missionaries are really seeing some hard times. As of today, March 4th one family only has enough support to pay their rent this month....I do not know how long they can hold out under such extreme conditions. The winter has been tough with sick children, high heat bills and now a big slack in churches faithfulness in support. God has allowed us to have a new ministry called Farmers of Faith, which is a ministry project. It is designed for farmers or anyone who would like to give a portion of land, crops, cattle, chickens, hogs or anything of that nature, to go directly to help in the mission effort. So far this year Farmers of Faith has helped a missionary with a van purchase, another missionary that had a terrible month last month in support and now this month another will be helped to stay on the field. It is a blessing and I pray we can expand Farmers of Faith over the next year to help in some building projects as well as other needy areas in our Lord's Harvest.

Our schedule is filling for the year and we are looking for a great year in the Lord. Christine and I are planning a trip to the Philippines in October to visit a couple of our missionaries.
