Dear Praying Friends,

Happy New Year! It is our prayer that 2014 will be a year of blessing for our ministry here in Romania, and that we will see the people of our church grow spiritually and see souls saved.

We had some special activities during the Christmas holidays. Our annual Christmas program went very well. There were 18 children in the program complete with costumes, and they did a great job. Bob preached a salvation message explaining the true meaning of Christmas. There were 35 who came to see the children perform: 19 adults and 16 children. Each person in attendance received a bulletin which contained our weekly church schedule and a Christmas sermon. They also received a Christmas salvation tract. We went Christmas caroling with 20 of our most faithful attenders and handed out Christmas salvation tracts at each house. We also had a Christmas party for the children who were in the Christmas program.

Our attendance continues to average around 30 for each service and activity. Bogdan, the 24-year-old physicallyhandicapped man, invited teenagers from his village, and about six of them have been attending for about eight weeks now.

Bob has recovered nicely from his prostate surgery. His recovery took longer than expected because of the internal bleeding he experienced after the surgery and the lymph fluid which kept building up. The doctor is pleased with his progress.

Marianne had been experiencing breathing difficulties during the past year. She had visited many doctors trying to find the cause. Her last visit was with an allergy/immunology doctor. The doctor said that Marianne's breathing difficulties occur because she is not getting enough oxygen in her lungs. Marianne has been using an inhaler on a daily basis and has been feeling much better.

We are still searching for homes where we can conduct home Bible studies for adults. We have been able to find a few individuals who may allow us to use their homes. Bob's prolonged recovery and the Christmas holidays have postponed our search for locations.

We will be having a winter day camp for two days the first week in February. We are planning on having about 25 in attendance.

It is our hope to begin work on step one of the multipurpose building project in the near future. The multipurpose building will be a tremendous help in reaching our area with the Gospel. It will also aid us in reaching older teens and adults. Step one will be to buy and put in place the poles that will support the sides and the roof. Then the entire building area would need to be cemented. This step will cost \$10,000. The total project is estimated at
