<u>FULL STEAM AHEAD</u> – The New Year has brought renewed vision and enthusiasm to everyone and the church is both going and growing again. With many of our core people out of town or working, we still had 59 in attendance last Sunday with 3 first time visitors. Twenty- one adults attended Sunday School class to study discipleship! The good numbers are encouraging but more rewarding is that we continue to see new folks with a hunger for God's Word and a desire to grow in grace. They are learning how to love and serve the Lord. Brother Amantle has become a treasured



Timothy. He has a shepherd's heart and is preparing to be a Pastor. He now coordinates soul-winning and outreach on Saturdays and last Sunday began teaching a new SS class, THE GIDEONS, with a burden to see the older boys become manly and Godly men. He had 7 for his first class and they are all going canvassing on Saturday. Many of these boys don't have a father figure in their life. Please pray that God will raise up some Gideons for God! Moses, a man in his fifties and a pastor of two churches for more than 10 years was legitimately born again recently and is now



studying Bible Doctrines in the Grace Baptist Bible Institute. Recently he sent me this text: "Hello and Amen Pastor! Am happy because today I was preaching about the life of Christ at workplace. They enjoyed the scriptures! Hallelujah!"

At the moment we are working on a new church plant in a village of more than 3000 people and 3 New Testament distribution projects to a military base, the special forces police service, and a teachers training college. The kids are back in the public schools and attendance at the After School Bible Clubs is really growing. Cindy, Emily, and Ms. Tjada are doing a great job teaching the kids the Bible by its stories and we hope to add two more schools this year. A wonderful Mission team with precious folks from Maranatha BC in West VA were with us for ten days and distributed approx.. 4000 scriptures and spent hours stamping and labeling New Testaments for the future distribution projects.
